WHERE ARE YOU? Jay

I've started reading detective stories again, a reversion to childhood. In one that I recently finished the villain was a cross dresser. I quite like it when the villain is in some way transgendered; it's an acceptance without anyone feeling the need to be politically correct.

This particular villain was quite interesting. He built an elaborate series of facades, he planned escape routes, he had strategies for avoiding discovery, his plans were well thought out and covered every eventuality, he made sure his tracks were always covered and that no-one could discover his activities. No-one really knew him, no-one knew what he did. When he was finally caught, the detective made a big effort to understand him, to discover what made him tick. He couldn't explain, it was just the way he worked. He had spent so much time covering his tracks, he had almost lost himself.

It's not difficult to understand. Before I contemplated transition I was there but I wasn't. I was a husband, a father, a successful executive, an assistant church warden, and quite a number of other things. I did what was required of me but I wasn't there. A big part of me wasn't present, and there was no way that anyone was going to know about that part. I revelled in the anonymity of the big city, valued the privacy that it gave. No-one knew me.

It worked but of course it was quite unsatisfactory. Since accepting myself as I really am, and changing my life to live accordingly, it has become hugely more satisfying, life in all its fullness. Having become open to all, it has enabled me to give more fully and in return I have received in abundance. My faith belief is that God has given us life, in all its abundance, and it is up to us to make the most of that gift, and give thanks.

It worries me that so many transgendered people are living half lives in the shadows. They are missing so much, and, in a sense, they are failing to make the most of God's gift.

#### THE FUTURE OF THE TRANS COMMUNITY

#### (In response to Elen Heart's article in NL48)

<u>I</u> suppose that for many trans-people, modern technology seems to be a blessing; because it has seemingly "fixed" the gender riddle for them, and it causes annoyance if anyone suggests that there may be an alternative solution to the riddle that transgender poses us.

I think that Elen was opening up this issue in her article, and was anxious to avoid well-worn paths.

Perhaps we do not have a static issue here but an EVOLVING path.

It is my personal view that science and technology, great as they are in a way, (when it comes to observation accuracy, experimentation, classification and measuring,) are very clever. I speak as a science graduate. Also they give us great power; "To be like Gods". Gods of a sort controlling and exploiting nature; like a man plundering a woman.

But when it comes to the soul, the psyche, then it's different.

Science has grown strong by EXCLUDING feeling, experience and LOVE from its investigations. *Cold objectivity* is its ethos. How then could a science which excludes the soul's living experience from its investigations, ever hope to contribute to understanding of the soul, in which it does not even believe, since souls cannot be seen, weighed, touched, or most of all CONTROLLED?

Science's attitude to the soul is best summed up in the picture of the Caliph of Baghdad and his attitude to the girls of his realm in "Arabian Nights".

I mean, you cannot measure, organise, or control feelings as you can clockwork and machines. They are altogether not reducible to predictability: too alive, too FEMININE.

However, there *is* a bodily aspect to gender too. The *feeling*, "I have been born into a body of the wrong gender" is a SOUL phenomenon firstly, but it is true that the problem has a perceptible bodily aspect too.

This is where modern science feels competent, in the realm of "bits of a machine", and comes in with its reassignment technique and gives you a refit, just as it does for your car.

But is it legitimate to ask, "Is this technological approach really a very complete answer to this riddle in today's world?" Haven't we outgrown such approaches to some extent?

Anyway, are these same body technologists (who are busily earning fortunes reshaping women's bodies to order with nose, boob, leg jobs and God knows what else), really so scientifically objective as they pretend, even in their own field?

For example; some facts.:

- 1. A woman's menstrual period is precisely in days, the same as the moons revolution about the earth. 28-29
- 2. Human beings breathe on average 18 times a minute or 25920 times a day. This number also represents the number of years it takes the sun's spring rising point to pass backwards around the Zodiac
- 3. Human gestation takes 10 lunar months.

Does this mean that we are somehow built on the same pattern as the cosmos to some extent at least?

Say these things to your average comprehensive-school educated man-in-the-street and he will probably sneer, look away, change the subject, be non-plussed or say, "so what?". Mr indoctrinated-man-in-the-street, would need an authority to tell him he may even <u>consider</u> these observations, let alone feel their significance. He will want to know that they can be used to pass an exam, or get more salary or importance or status. Since his authorities give no credit to these <u>facts and</u> correspondences, he stifles his wonder, interest and love for truth at the first

instant, and sees nothing in them. But tell them to Mrs, Average woman -in-the-Street, and she will often be thrilled, expectant and delighted, until she remembers that her husband /father/brother or son will consider her a fool for believing such rubbish.

Which tells us, doesn't it, that to **see**, you need a **soul** as well as an eye?

Perhaps Nature has given women a" Soul-Start" in life. As a woman you are given more soul-force in your body, while men get (by and large) a compensating dose of physical power over **things.** 

Is it possible that this is behind the gender issue? We have a science grown great by denying soul, on the grounds that it cannot be *seen*.

Anyone who says there is a soul in a human body or even in an animal, risks being labelled psychotic by modern science. "You are seeing things."

In other words science has become a typical husband of today. How can he hope to understand what he has spent time denying.? He has developed a technology whose ethic is MALE in every way, and we ask **this science** to help us elucidate our gender issue, to tell us why we feel a lack in the person heredity and society would make of us.

Perhaps, as the aptly named Elen *Heart* implies, there is more to this question than meets the eye, the eye and brain conditioned to outward things. Perhaps, It is the Heart that sees.\*

#### SATELLITE NAVIGATION

Increasingly, modern cars are fitted with Satellite Navigation systems (SatNav for short). This is a device which provides directions and a map to assist journey planning and driving. For cars that don't come equipped with such a device, one can buy an add-on for a couple of hundred pounds.

I was sitting, minding my own business (if you believe that, you'll believe anything!) in our Bible study group a few weeks ago and I thought how the Bible could be likened to a SatNav system. There are several things you can do with it.

Firstly, you can buy it and leave it on the shelf unused. It doesn't necessarily mean that you'll make a wrong turning; just as there are road signs to guide your way, we all have built-in safeguards to try and ensure that we follow the correct route. It may be to do with the way we're brought up; it may be that magic ingredient called 'conscience' that tells us when a particular course of action may or may not be appropriate.

The vast majority of people manage very well without a SatNav, just as they do without a Bible. There is no doubt, however, that much of the so-called 'conscience' of modern living can be found in the Bible. Studying the Bible can reveal hidden depths that many people, including scholars, don't plumb. A SatNav, used with a good portion of common sense, can help find the shortest, quickest or most scenic route between two places and can help find unfamiliar destinations with ease. Like many things, SatNavs can be very helpful, but can make terrible masters. So can Bibles.

Just after Christmas, a friend and I found some beautiful and rugged landscape on the Cheshire/Derbyshire border, just three miles from Macclesfield, simply by entering 'Point of Interest' into a SatNav. A roadmap and road signs didn't alert us at all to the isolated, peaceful spot that we found. Several thousand feet above sea level, it even had that desirable ingredient – a pub that served an excellent lunch.

My friend frequently attends meetings in unfamiliar city centres and being able to enter a postcode, and have the machine direct her to the door, is a godsend. She does, of course, need to temper the machine's guidance with good old common sense.

You may be familiar with the computer industry's famous motto; 'GIGO' or 'Garbage In, Garbage Out'. If you insist on asking the wrong question, there's every chance that you'll get an answer that's just no use to you.

Same with the Bible. If you take bits in isolation, they will probably add up to the wrong solution. My friend Helen used to quote, "'They took flight' doesn't mean we should all immediately go out and buy airline tickets!"

**FANTASIA** Jay

Fantasia is a glorious belly dance festival, held once a year over a weekend in a performing arts college in West London, and it happened in December. At any given time over that weekend, there are about five workshops taking place with good teachers where you can learn much more about your chosen aspect of the dance. There is an excellent souk or market where most of the clothes vendors have stalls and you can buy all sorts of costumes and adornments. There is a lovely show by the professionals and their dancers on the Saturday evening. Lastly it is a golden opportunity to catch up with old friends. I love it.

The organiser of this Aladdin's Cave is a woman I like very much. Having taken over from her sister who founded the whole thing, she and her team look after all these many dancers and teachers, and make sure that everything happens when it should and that all runs smoothly and to time. She's nice and we get on well.

This year she shook me rigid when I came through the door. She said that she was so pleased to see me as she regarded me as her guardian angel. I always asked after her and her staff and checked up during what is a hard day for them that they were Ok and feeling fine. She said that I was always so calm and when she saw me going about the place, she knew that everything would be alright.

How flattering but yet what misplaced faith. There's nothing that I do or could do that would bring good fortune or avert disaster; I have about as much influence as the man in the moon. Indeed from the perspective of certain religious people, how shocking and how blasphemous. No angel I. And yet she felt this.

My cat does much the same for me. We have shared this house for seventeen years and she has her routine. About three times a day she will sit by or on me and be companionable. However if I am unwell or unhappy she will quietly come up to me and stay with me, close by, sleeping peacefully, but always by me. That too is very reassuring.

Matthew 25.31 et seq I have always found to be a very hard passage. You know it - the one about the sheep and the goats and doing it to the least of the afflicted is doing it for Jesus. I know I am one of the goats. Sick visiting, prison visiting,

feeding and clothing I am not good at. Temperamentally it's not me. I know I don't do it, not at all or not properly or well. By that passage of scripture I stand condemned; whichever way I look at it, I don't measure up.

Enter the Rev'd John Pridmore. I don't know him but he is a retired rector, formerly of Hackney. Until recently he wrote a regular commentary in *The Church Times* on the week's readings. His take on this passage was that no-one could be expected to do it for all suffering humanity. The saving line was that if you did it "for one of my brothers here, however insignificant, you did it for me." One is manageable, the entire world is not. However the passage goes on to say "anything you failed to do for one of these, however insignificant, you failed to do for me." That's pretty devastating. Like many of Jesus' parables, they are too hard for imperfect humanity.

Perhaps we can put this in the context of Sibyls and look for hope there. Sibyls has always tried to be there, one for the other. Immediately one can think of Sibyls who are in prison, not Her Majesty's, but those of their own or society's making - and we do visit them. There are those seeking health - and we are there to encourage and help. Clothes - well, we try to make sure people are properly and rightly clothed. For those that are hungry and thirsty, food and drink has been an important part of Sibyls. Perhaps, in a small way, just perhaps, we are trying. Perhaps God in his mercy .....

So what else is to be done? I find as I get older that I am not as good at doing as I used to be and less keen to be doing. However being is very important. At any age you can turn your mind to being, and that can be very significant.

Back to my friend at Fantasia. After pondering her words for a few days and wondering about their significance, eventually the penny dropped. Without being spoken, without even being thought about in those terms, what is happening is love. She is making things happen for other people and concerned that all goes well; that is love. I am concerned for her and her people's welfare; without any fuss whatsoever, that is love. We like each other, and that too is love. The cat also is giving love.

Of course love is reassuring. With it, all things are full of hope and are possible. And, if it's present, can God be far behind?

#### The Words of God -

Dr. Laura Schlessinger is an FM radio personality who dispenses advice to people who call in to her radio show. Recently, she said that, as an observant Orthodox Jew, transvestism and transsexualism are abominations according to Leviticus 18:22. The following is an open letter to Dr. Laura which was posted on the Internet. It's funny, as well as informative ...

#### Dear Dr. Laura:

Thank you for doing so much to educate people regarding God's Law. I have learned a great deal from your radio show, and try to share that knowledge with as many people as I can. When someone tries to defend the cross-dressing / transsexual lifestyles, for example, I simply remind them that Leviticus 18:22 clearly states they are abominations. End of debate.

I do need some advice from you, however, regarding some of the other specific laws and how to follow them:-

When I burn a bull on the altar as a sacrifice, I know it creates a pleasing odour for the Lord - Lev.1:9. The problem is my neighbours. They claim the odour is not pleasing to them. Should I smite them? Or can I sell them steak butties?

I would like to sell my daughter into slavery, as sanctioned in Exodus 21:7. In this day and age, what do you think would be a fair price for her?

I know that I am allowed no contact with a woman while she is in her period

of menstrual un-cleanliness - Lev.15:19-24. The problem is, how do I tell? I have tried asking, but most women take offence and even smite me!

Lev. 25:44 states that I may indeed possess slaves, both male and female, provided they are purchased from neighbouring nations. A friend of mine claims that this applies to Spanish and Italians but not to the French, Dutch or German people. Can you clarify? Why can't I own some Spanish senoritas? I have a neighbour whose job includes working on the Sabbath. Exodus 35:2 clearly states he should be put to death. Am I morally obligated to kill him myself?
